A CHAMPION FOR ONE. HOPE FOR MILLIONS.

What do you do when you feel like you are without hope, in a situation that looks hopeless?

As the Syrian war enters its fourth year, it is hard to find a reason for hope. Violence is escalating. The numbers of people affected are staggering. Looking at the conflict from the outside, it is impossible to comprehend the millions of lives that have been devastated by the conflict.

But what if we consider just one life?

Think about a young girl—a Syrian fourth-grader who is now an out-of-school refugee in Jordan. She used to play in a park near her school with her classmates. Now, she is surrounded by a plot of desert speckled by tents and caravans. No school, no park, no buddies.

Hopeless. *What does she do?*

Her survival depends on a strong friend—someone who understands her, someone who relates to her experience, someone who can help restore her hope.

Left with nothing to stand on, she needs someone to lean on. *She needs a champion.*

The story of this one young girl represents the reality for millions of young Syrians. As their hope fades, we are faced with the growing realization that **something must be done**. Something **can** be done.

Throughout urban areas of **Jordan** in 2013, more than 800 children found a champion in the safety of our alternative education classes. In Za'atari refugee camp alone, 100 Syrian mentors empowered a generation of more than 500 refugees to have choices other than alienation and violence. These children now have a reason to hope.



More than 500 volunteers inside **Syria** committed to rebuilding their communities in 2013. They assisted 34,000 Syrians in obtaining shelter and water, providing trauma support and securing education. In the rubble of destroyed cities, they are discovering a starting point for the future—hope for every person.


Hopeless? Not at all!

Hope is the light when all other lights go out. 2013 was a year of living hopefully. Thank you for being a vital partner with us. Please join us in 2014!

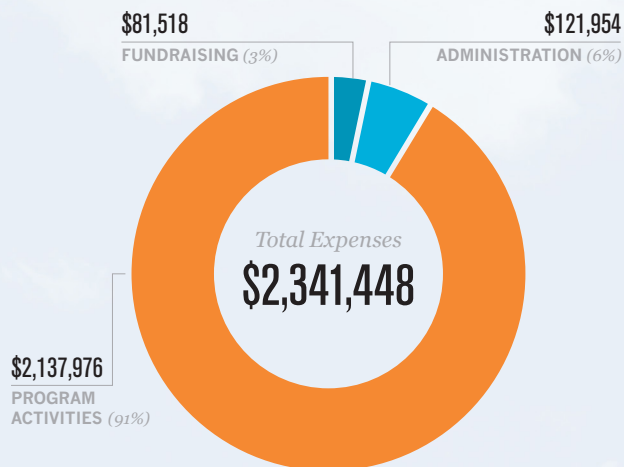
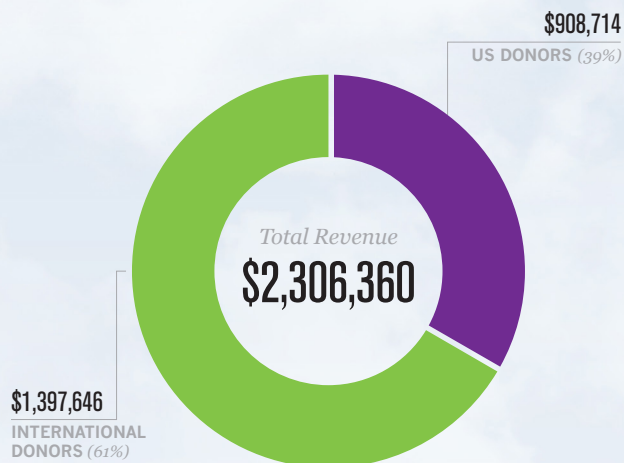
